Paul Harpley, Long-time Artist of Killarney Provincial Park

Paul is well-known as an important painter of Algonquin, but many do not know that he has been canoeing and painting in Killarney for over 25 years. Back in the 1980's and 90's he undertook wilderness art trips with wife Debra and his young children, and friends in the Park interior. O.S.A. Lake and the La Cloche White Quartzite Mountains around Silver Peak are some of his favourite places and spaces. Frequent subjects of his art as watercolours, plein-air acrylic paintings, Killarney wildlife works and graphite pencil studies.

Mr. Harpley led outings for the original Federation of Ontario Naturalists (now Ontario Nature) into the Killarney interior in the 1990's before the Park became as popular and busy as it is today. As an early environmentalist and well-known Canadian naturalist, he was an original advocate for nature, involved in important conservation movements like Save the Rouge, the Lake Simcoe Act establishment,

and an early supporter of northern Ontario issues like the Red-squirrel Road ancient Red Pine forest destruction in Temagami, canoeing in that district in the early 1990's.

“Artist in Residence” – Paul Harpley – Killarney Provincial Park

The week following the Killarney Park Art Show (Monday July 30th to Friday August 3rd) **Paul Harpley will be in the Park as the Artist in Residence. He will be instructing daily art workshops** at the George Lake Campground focusing on drawing and watercolour work in Killarney, for the “Friends of Killarney Park”.

As well as developing how to see and read landscapes and objects for drawing, participants in the program will begin to see how to exceed their expectations of their capabilities. Expectations are to impart what technical skills and artistic

inclinations of fine drawing and painting in watercolour to art workshop participants and Park visitors.

As an Ontario naturalist and wildlife researcher he will also be able to interpret landscape and wildlife in different ways than most artists to visitors, in his workshops. Through his presence and interaction with Park visitors, and with many years of interior canoeing and knowledge of past historical artists in Killarney, all he comes in contact with, take away new knowledge and perceptions.

Water, Energy and Climate laws in Bill C-69 July, 2018

Canadian Federal Government Fumbles on future Canadian Environment

I have disappointing news to share with you.

Remember how the Trudeau government shut down debate on proposed water, energy and climate laws in Bill C-69 twice already? Well last week the Trudeau government introduced two more motions that shut down debate a third and fourth time. This will force Members of Parliament (MPs) to vote on Bill C-69 in the House of Commons any day now.

You can still have your say! The Council of Canadians has just launched a new tool that will allow you to send a message directly to your MP calling on them to vote Bill C-69 down and commit instead to a national action plan on water that would create a Minister of Water cabinet position and enshrine the UN recognized human rights to water and sanitation.

Bill C-69 returned to the House of Commons last week. MPs will begin third reading and a motion will force a vote on this complex and flawed Bill any day now without the democratic debate it needs.

Simply put, Bill C-69 greases the wheels for pipelines, powerlines and other large-scale energy projects, leaving any nearby water vulnerable to pollution and contamination.

Bill C-69 will not protect every lake and every river from risky pipelines like Kinder Morgan's pipeline, or the 118 proposed Site C-type dams. Bill C-69 will also fail to require free, prior and informed consent required in the UN Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples, despite the Trudeau government recently committing to implement it.

In comparison, a national action plan on water (that respects UNDRIP, and protects waterways from tar sands pipelines and mega-dams) and the creation of a Minister of Water position would help protect water now and for future generations.

I'm heartened by the actions you and thousands of others have already taken to make it clear that we all have a voice in protecting water.

Your voice is now needed more than ever.

Please write your MP today and urge them to scrap Bill C-69 and support instead a national action plan on water.
